Call for Education Space Proposals

The Education Space Working Group (ESWG) is contributing to the Comprehensive Parnassus Heights Plan (CPHP) project, which is working with Perkins Eastman "to define a long-term programmatic strategy and vision for the Parnassus campus, translated into a physical design and plan." As part of this effort, the ESWG has been charged to "solicit and prioritize innovative and flexible educational space plans in support of the vision" and "propose more detailed plans for short and medium-term opportunities, such as Clinical Sciences Building, University Hall, and the Parnassus Library."

The ESWG seeks short (1-2 page) concept-level proposals from the education community in support of this charge. Proposals should address identified pedagogical or programmatic needs. Proposals do not need to specify a location, exact floorplan, budget, or timeline. However, information about preferences or opportunities in these areas is welcome. For example, proposals might include requirements for a 50-seat classroom, prioritize being located near the new hospital, or identify a new partnership with the Library's Makers Lab. The CPHP is planning for a twenty-year timeline. Please identify if your proposal addresses current needs / existing programs (e.g. not enough classrooms), planned programs (e.g. starting new degree program in 5 years), or an aspirational future setting (e.g. virtual/augmented reality interprofessional learning environment).

At this time, no specific space or funding has been identified. Responses will be provided to the CPHP Steering Committee and will be used by campus administration in future space planning activities.

Respondents should consider the principles and guidelines articulated in the *Report of Principles and Policies for Educator and Education Space*, the *Report of Principles and Policies Underpinning Non-Direct Patient Care Activities*, the *ESWG Education Space Guidelines* and the *Library Education Space Principles* (attached).
